10. a) Summary description of charter school:

Legacy Preparatory Academy builds the foundation of knowledge and critical thinking skills necessary for children to become independent learners for life.

Our mission is to:

- •Provide a classically-based curriculum that is thorough and challenging
- •Integrate fine arts to enhance learning
- •Teach the value of public virtue to promote respect
- •Engage parents as real partners to share in enriching student education
- •Honor each child as an individual and foster their innate curiosity and desire to learn
- b) How many students does the charter school serve and what grades?

According to LPA's 2011 Clearinghouse report, LPA has 993 students in grades K-12. We are chartered for 1010 students.

c) Does the charter school's grade configuration align with the local school district configuration?

Generally yes, it aligns with Davis School District's overall grade configuration. However, LPA's 6th grade is considered middle school, and 9th grade is considered high school.

d) Percentage of ethnic minority students at charter school and resident district:

Based on the school's 2011 fall enrollment, Legacy Preparatory Academy serves 13.4% minority students and Davis School District serves 15.2%.

e) Percentage of economically disadvantaged students at charter school and resident district:

Based on the school's 2011 fall enrollment, Legacy Preparatory Academy serves 20.1% economically disadvantaged students, and Davis School District serves 25.5%.

f) Percentage of special education students at charter school and resident district:

Based on the school's 2011 fall enrollment, Legacy Preparatory Academy serves 7.8% special education students, and Davis School District serves 10.0%.

- 11. What makes this school unique or needed?

In accordance with our charter, Legacy Preparatory Academy offers a classical education model for all students. For high school students, LPA also offers a concurrent enrollment program through UVU. The Classical Education Trivium provides a unique opportunity for students to learn and develop through three specific stages that are designed to coincide with their natural development: the grammar stage, the logic stage, and the rhetoric stage. LPA's classical approach offers elementary students instruction in the grammar stage and direct instruction to help build the foundations of knowledge and of basic reading and math skills. During the early years of instruction, classical education focuses on two purposes: to teach the child to read quickly, well, and habitually; and to fill the student's mind with stories of every kind, such as myths, legends, classic tales, biographies, poems,

and great stories from history. Students in grades 6-8 receive instruction in the logic stage to help them organize information and to understand the way facts fit together into a logical framework. With these skills, students build greater comprehension capabilities. Students in grades 9-12 have the opportunity to participate in the Socratic method to best develop the problem solving and critical thinking skills formed during rhetoric stage of the Classical Education Trivium. High school students have many opportunities to develop their critical thinking skills in written and oral expressions of analysis. In addition, high school students may participate in a concurrent college enrollment program, which allows them to take college classes at Utah Valley University without leaving the high school campus. Through interactive video conferencing, LPA students can see, hear, and talk to UVU professors and on-campus UVU students. This interaction allows students to ask questions, share opinions and ideas in discussions, and to fully participate in college classes.

Yes, LPA's curriculum is fully aligned with the Utah Common Core. We are also currently working on alignment with the new Common Core.

13. How does the school address the needs of students with disabilities who need Special Education services?

LPA has a Special Ed. Director, 3 Special Ed. teachers, and 8 paraprofessionals. LPA follows IDEA requirements, including offering a continuum of placement and services for all eligible students.

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


